Cost-Share Program

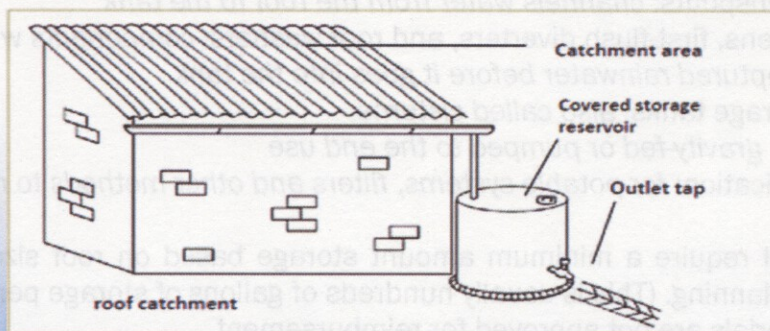
*Rainwater harvesting captures, diverts and stores
